Joan McCalla

Joan McCalla was appointed Chief Strategist in the Ontario government's new information and information technology (I&IT) organization in May 1999. The Chief Strategist is responsible for leading the development and implementation of enterprise-wide information and information technology strategies, plans, and policies aligned with business directions. The function includes leadership for, and specific initiatives in support of, electronic government. The Office is responsible for the corporate Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy activities, HR and communications functions for the I&IT organization, and the controllership function for I&IT, including providing advice to Management Board of Cabinet on major I&IT-related decisions.

Joan has been with the Ontario government since 1977 in various planning and policy positions at several ministries, including directing the development and implementation of the provincial telecommunications and computing sector and provincial infrastructure strategies while with the Ministry of Economic Development and Trade in the 1990's. Prior to joining the Ontario government, Joan was a land use planner with the City of Mississauga.

Joan is a graduate of the University of Toronto (M.Sc. Urban and Regional Planning) and the University of Alberta (B.A. Honours Geography).



Honourable Jim Wilson

Minister of Northern Development and Mines and Chair,
Northern Ontario Heritage Fund Corporation

Jim Wilson has been active in politics all of his life. During university and upon graduation, he was an assistant to former Ontario Management Board Chair George McCague. Federally, he was Special Assistant to Perrin Beatty in both the National Defense, and Health and Welfare portfolios.

Raised and educated in Alliston, Ontario, Minister Wilson went on to study political science and Christian studies at the University of Toronto.

He was first elected to the Ontario Legislature as the member for Simcoe-West in September 1990. When he was re-elected in 1995, he was appointed to Cabinet as Minister of Health. In October 1997, he was assigned to the newly formed Ministry of Energy, Science and Technology. Since 1999, he has represented the new riding of Simcoe-Grey.

Minister Wilson is the first Ontario Cabinet Minister to have been given specific responsibility for Science and Technology, where his role was to keep the province on the leading edge of technological and scientific advancement.

He is probably best known for initiating and implementing Ontario's health care reform process, and more recently for championing electricity restructuring as sponsor of the government's Energy Competition Act.

As Minister of Northern Development and Mines and Chair of the Northern Ontario Heritage Fund Corporation, he will use the knowledge and experience he has gained as a senior member of the Ontario Cabinet to aggressively promote the North and address the critical issues facing Northerners.
